



The Political Science minor provides students with an introduction to the discipline or the opportunity to specialize in one or two subfields. The sub-fields are American Politics, International relations, comparative politics or political thought. There are two alternatives for fulfilling the minor:

 : Three courses distributed among three of the four major sub-fields of political science, plus three Political Science electives (6 courses, 18 hours)

 : Three courses in one of the major sub-fields, plus any other three Political Science electives (6 courses, 18 hours).

The Asian Studies Minor prepares students for career opportunities in law, business, journalism, arts, and education through interdisciplinary study of the geography, history, business, economics, politics, and culture of Asia.
