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COURSE DESCRIPTION This course addresses feminist activism on a wide range of issues (including domestic violence, rape, education and health care), and in a variety of forms (including writing, theater, public protests and coalition building). It gives students the opipotoustudy the scholarship of activism and to participate in feminist action.

Attendance: Attendance is necessary in this class. Students can miss 3 classes throughout the course of the semester, without penalty. Additional absences will lower your participation grade. <u>Participation:</u> Attendance is key, but participation goes beyond your presence in the room. Participation means reading materials in adva**bring**ing them to class, listening to your classmates, and making your own contributions to discussions. It means listening with curiosity and keeping an open mind, taking notes, and asking questions of your peers. Participation is about making this classi**tle**erent than it would be if you, specifically, were not a part of it.

<u>Discussion Leads</u>:Throughout the semestestudentswill rotate leading the discussion the case study assigned for that dat wo students will be assigned per day, each responsible for half of the required components, as well as one discussion question (two discussion questions tudents) will be expected to provide an overview of the activist/ action, including informatiout 1) the vision and values thepeopleinvolved, 3) the actics used, 4) the cale of the action (individual, interpersonal, institutional, etc) and its 5) impact as well as to offer 6) at least or discussion question Each student will be sponsible for leading discussion times during the semester.

Personal Reflections: Personal reflections are short, written reflections that invite you to reflect on your own experience as a feminist/ activist. The seert, written reflection ask you to conside your own experience conversation with seigned sources and larger themes related to feminism in action. You are required to complete the 5 assigned personal reflections.

Mini - Actions: Mini - actions ofer creative opportunities to take feminist action inspired by a particular case study. For example, you might [x, y, or z]. Students are also welcome to propose an

alternative miniaction in advance of the deadline. Students are required to compute in each unit.

<u>Post-It Action:</u> The postit action is an informal, lowstakes opportunity to engage in feminist activism. Each student will be given 10 patentotes and be asked to
