2021 2022 Sponsor Evaluation: City Garden Montessori School

Failure to achieve certain Performance Contract standards may result in SLU equirements of the schoolinc luding, but not limited to, the following:

- 'the submission of a school report to SLUaddressing the sources of concerns as well asschool plans for remediation for the hoof above) on charter's website for
- 'a schoolcontractwith an independent, external auditor/consultant approved by SLU and the completion of an audit of the school's educational, financial, or organization aperformance as defined by SLU;
- 'specific training for board members administrators staff, or teachers.
