
This policy describes the qualifications necessary to offered by the seeking to teach a course offered by the members. Individuals seeking to teach for SPS and who have been university within the last two years to serve as an instructor must meet at least one or the minimum qualifications noted in this policy. Documentation alreadymitted by these individuals to the University will be reviewed by the program Director and the SPS Associate Dean in lieu of the review process stated in this policy.

- B. Instructors shall have earned the required academic credentials at a regionally accredited United States institution or a foreign institution having the equivalent of regional accreditation. Instructors with credentials from a institutions will have bein transcripts evaluated by agencies that have good standing with the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services to establish fulfillment of this standard.
- C. If current professional registration, government licensure, certifications, or familyliwith special equipment, processes, or computer software are required, all instructors must continue to maintain such credentials, or reapply for a teaching position demonstrating compliance with the minimum qualifications.
- D. In extenuating circumstates, provisional approval may be granted by the Dean for instructors who do not meet the published qualifications. Once granted, continued provisional approval will granted upon a positive teaching performance review.
