Dr. Whitt called the meeting to order and introductions. The minutes from May 2, 2022 were approved as submitted.

Dr. Whitt outlined the duties of the Academic Affairs Committee. The committee is responsible for making recommendations to the vice presidents concerning new undergraduate academic programs, policies affecting undergraduate education throughout the university. The committee also oversees the faculty subcommittee that reviews all new programs and proposals. The committee also makes recommendations to the vice presidents concerning new graduate academic programs, policies affecting graduate education, and new graduate programs. All faculty will be asked to take formal actions at the end of the meeting.

Proposals:

a. Overview/Review of the Saint Louis University Graduate Education

- Dr. Sanchez stated that the recent government action by the Department of Education have announced that specialized certificates are no longer eligible for funding or grants to be “eligible”.
- Each institution must report its situation status, attainment of jobs, advancement opportunities.
- Saint Louis University uses a term certificate “which has been a source of pride of the school. Many programs that were originally called “certificate” are now minors.

b. Certificate in Geographic Information Systems

- Dr. Walamu explained the Department of Earth and Atmospheric Sciences offers a graduate certificate and are proposing to offer a certificate in addition to the graduate certificate. The certificate offers a mix of GIS theory and practical training
- The program is an 18 credit hour certificate
- All courses are taught online with graduate courses
- The faculty sub-committee will meet to continue discussion of the program.

Updates:

a. B.S. Psychology Curriculum Neuroscience

- Dr. Whitt stated there is continuing curriculum development. Psychology proposals will be reviewed by the Curriculum Committee.
- The B.S. in Neuroscience needs to be revised and will be added to the FY17 budget discussions.

b. Review of Academic Policies

- An analysis was done regarding faculty teaching load and how grades are used/not used.
- Some faculty have taught in grades and now the "Incomplete" grade is under review.
- Repeat courses will be taken into account in calculating the GPA.
- Discussion has begun to only count until the final grade is submitted.
- There is currently no discussion on the assignment of grades.
- Contact Dr. Whitt or Sandie Clegg with questions.

c. Student Success Center (newly undergoing reorganization)

- Shelley Sawant has left the University.
- Lisa Israel has left with Map Works, tutoring and writing.
- Kelly Herboldt is responsible for the new SCSO transition office.
- Jane Jones was recently hired as the Program Director for Disability Services.
- Presently the recommendation has been for an academic committee to review the existing reviewed.
- The Early Warning system is linked to everyone connected to a student, thus the primary advisor is the "point person".
- Susan Egan's annualized Fall and Spring Review is being done in Learning Communities, there are 407 students who are members of POGS.
- John Welch stated there is a proposal for an academic re-organization of the Michael campus; updates will be given as they occur.
- Kent Porterfield stated Mona Hicks will be conducting her pre-ming presidential election.
✓ As of August 20, housing rates of 99% of students are living on campus.)
